If you are cast and major conflicts arise shortly after, you may be asked to withdraw from the show. So, please be as honest and forthright with your conflicts as possible.

ROLES AVAILABLE IN RAGTIME

BOOKER T. WASHINGTON 45-55	The dominant figure in the African American community of the United States at the turn of the century. Vocal range top: Eb4 Vocal range bottom: D3
COALHOUSE WALKER, JR. 30s	A proud, sophisticated man who fights to live within his social boundaries. However, he also reflects the unbridled rage experienced by vast numbers of African Americans at the hands of an often unjust society that was America in this era. Vocal range top: A4 Vocal range bottom: G2
EMMA GOLDMAN 30-40	The Russian born radical anarchist in early 1900's New York City. Vocal range top: D5 Vocal range bottom: B3
EVELYN NESBIT 18-25	The beautiful vaudeville performer, famous for the murder of her high profile lover by her rich husband. Vocal range top: D5 Vocal range bottom: B3
FATHER 30-45	Rich, conservative, staunch in his ways but not intentionally unkind. Vocal range top: F4 Vocal range bottom: A2
GRANDFATHER 50-65	Mother's conservative father. A retired professor. Irritated by everything.
HENRY FORD 35-45	An American industrialist and founder of the Ford Motor Company.
HARRY HOUDINI 25-35	The famous magician who immigrated to America and made a name for himself largely as an escape artist. Vocal range top: G4 Vocal range bottom: E3
J.P. Morgan 60-65	The rich, famous financier.
LITTLE BOY "EDGAR" 8-12	Mother and Father's son. Curious and kind. Vocal range top: D5 Vocal range bottom: E4
LITTLE GIRL 7-10	Tateh's daughter, a young Latvian girl in a new home. Vocal range top: Bb4 Vocal range bottom: C4
MOTHER 30s	A strong, kind woman who defies social norms to do the things she feels are morally right. Vocal range top: F#5 Vocal range bottom: G3
SARAH 18-25	A washwoman who is adopted into Mother's home when Mother finds Sarah's baby in the garden. Vocal range top: F#5 Vocal range bottom: G#3
SARAH'S FRIEND 18-25	A friend of Sarah's who attends her funeral.
TATEH 30-40	A haggard, Latvian immigrant who dreams the "American Dream" for himself and his daughter. Vocal range top: F# Vocal range bottom: Bb2
WILLIE CONKLIN 25-40	A racist volunteer fireman who destroys Coalhouse's car.
Younger Brother 20-30	Mother's younger brother who has his heart broken by Evelyn Nesbit and joins Coalhouse in his protests towards discrimination. He is a young man in search of something. Vocal range top: F#4 Vocal range bottom: B2
ENSEMBLE Large Ensemble Needed Various Ages	To play immigrants, citizens of New Rochelle and Harlem, Coalhouse supporters, reporters and various other supporting roles throughout the piece.
